Withdrawal from Operational Sites.

Your Police Federation along with its legal advisors are extremely pleased that at the Chapelcross, Capenhurst and Springfields sites TUPE is not being engaged for non firearms officers. From the outset and during this long process, the position adopted by your Staff Association and in which we have invested many resources, has achieved an outcome which in our view not only benefits our individual members effected by this decision but also the organisation.

Our emphasis now in this matter will be to focus on achieving a smooth transition for all of our colleagues affected by the withdrawal of the CNC at these units in line with our employer's conditions of employment.

In relation to members who are at risk of redundancy at these units I seek your further patience, as Government comes to its Easter recess, it is very possible that any formal notification in relation to a formal redundancy notification may not come until mid April.

Unnecessary speculation and rumor about the continued legal support of our members at the Capenhurst Site continues to circulate. For the avoidance of any doubt your Police Federation will continue to support all of its members, where ever they are located who find themselves in need of assistance when matters

Change in the Model of CNC Policing Dounreay

Discussions continue to take place between the CNPA/ CNC, and the SLC, and whilst we have been advised that the NDA are now actively involved in those discussions we have an expectation that the CNPA/CNC representatives will soon be in a position to advise us of the direction of travel those interested parties have agreed to adopt . As in all these matters the final sign off route we understand will have to go through the CNPA sponsoring dept DECC, and as such this could be protracted.

Futures

We have been advised that once again our employers the CNPA have written to DECC, to seek to make progress in this area of Pay and Conditions of Service for all Police Officers employed by the CNPA

Given the time lapse since the original “Futures “ paper was submitted for consideration to our sponsoring dept , both the CNC Branch of the PSAEW and ourselves have requested to be provided the with current “principle’s of the futures programme, we await an answer to this request.

We have been advised that the current position in relation to our pay and conditions of service shall remain the same as has been historically applied in the past : i.e. align to any negotiated agreement with the Police Negotiating Board in relation any salary increase which will no doubt will reflect the 2013 public sector pay cap of 1%.
